## Garbage

We want to thank everyone for doing a really good job of garbage and recycling disposal. We haven't had any issues of garbage in the recycling bin. We are also doing much better at breaking down our boxes. Great Job!

### Ash & Sand Cans



There have been some question and issues regarding our ash and sand cans. We should only be putting **cold** ash in the ash cans. Please do not put garbage into ash bins or the sand cans. The sand cans are distributed around the complex so that everyone can have access. The sand is there to provide traction on walk ways and streets in winter.

Ideally, sand should be spread on walkways, stairs and streets just before the snow hits. Once the snow has fallen, it can be extremely difficult and dangerous to haul sand to our homes. Each homeowner should consider filling a 1-5 gallon can with sand to keep near their home, so in winter ice conditions, you will have easy access to sand for your walkways and stairs.

### WHAT'S RECYCLABLE

- **Plastic** Containers; shampoo containers, food containers, cups, plates, packaging, Milk jugs, Household cleaning product containers, hard plastics, plastic bags, cleaned plastic flower pots.
- **Paper**; shredded paper, magazines, phonebooks, catalogues, milk cartons, drink boxes, newspaper..**Broken down Cardboard boxes**
- **Metals**; soda cans, tin and steel containers, **cleaned** latex paint cans, copper, brass, aerosol cans
- **Glass**; jars, bottles

## Property Improvement

We want to remind homeowners that outside home improvements, especially those involving common area existing construction or cutting of trees and shrubs in the common area **is not permissible without Board approval.**

This policy is not just to protect the association, but also yourselves. There are construction rules and infrastructure which may not be obvious, that must be accommodated for in your plan. Please submit your plans to the Board before proceeding. Thank you

We updated our Fine Policy to be more effective in deterring rule and policy violations, re-established the Newsletter, installed locks on our trash cans (which has eliminated outside dumping and keep trash fees down), and changed our home inspection policy to provide owners with a summer window to make repairs and shortened the period to complete repairs for quicker turn around. These are just a few of the efforts achieved in our never-ending goal to improve Ridgeline. I would like to take this opportunity to thank the board for its dedication to the Association and the residents it serves, to make Ridgeline a better place for all of us.

We do face new challenges for 2022. We are still working on the fiscal responsibility to ensure Ridgeline has the funds to provide the necessary maintenance and repairs required.
